

Indicative credit scoring model for the doctoral studies under the Doctoral Programme in Communication, Media and Theatre

In the UTA Doctoral School and the Doctoral Programme in Communication, Media and Theatre, courses have been scored in the same way as the basic studies courses. In other words, this credit scoring model mainly serves to assist the scoring of completed course units and study attainments other than actual completed courses.

Please note! The model is intended to serve as a loose guideline for consideration. Each study attainment must be assessed separately and the responsibility for this falls on the supervisor (1 ECTS = approx. 27 hours of work). The scoring model will be valid until further notice, and it is intended for supervisors to be used inside the unit.

Scientific publications (other than those included in a doctoral dissertation)

Domestic referee article	4–10 ECTS
International referee article	6–14 ECTS
Other scientific articles and textbook articles	2–8 ECTS
Scientific reviews and reports, literature reviews in scientific publications	2–8 ECTS
Editing of publications	4–10 ECTS

Presentations at scientific conferences, seminars and postgraduate education events

Presentation in the native language	2–4 ECTS
Presentation in a foreign language	4–6 ECTS

Providing education relevant to the degree 2–10 ECTS

Participating in scientific seminars and postgraduate education events (excl. the unit's own research seminar) 2–6 ECTS

Organising scientific conferences, seminars, postgraduate education events and working groups 2–6 ECTS

Other study attainments supporting the degree will be agreed upon on a case-by-case basis

These can include papers, working as part of the editorial staff of a scientific journal, planning, coordination and organisation tasks, issuing assessments and statements, memberships in working groups related to the doctoral studies or boards of scientific societies, as well as studies completed abroad.
